Many festive holiday celebrations took place at YVY sites. Children and staff, alike, enjoyed the various puppet shows and Mommy and Me gatherings (whether virtually or on-site). At one location, an EMT was invited to speak to children about health and safety and, at different sites, fire safety activities were conducted with the children. Teachers completed the Fall Teaching Strategies checkpoints and Parent Teachers conferences were duly held. Pedestrian Safety posters and cards were sent to all sites for sharing with families.

Head Start/EHS family workers are receiving training via Zoom in special topics twice a month. Numerous trainings for Teachers and Assistant teachers took place and additional trainings are planned for this month. Teacher training is a continuous never-ending process which promotes teaching skills and developing proficiency which, in turn, assists in students' learning.

A special curriculum training for teachers was held this winter at YVY's Lakewood EHS expansion program, which focused on implementing the Creative Curriculum Studies Approach to Teaching and Learning. Studies are 'long-term, in-depth investigations of topics that engage children in meaningful learning by leveraging their natural curiosity and sense of wonder to explore the complex nature of ordinary things'. The first study explored was on 'Containers'. The pictures below show students as they start their investigation of all different types of containers.

Governance

The YVY Policy Council continues its active role in the decision-making process of the HS/ EHS program. The newly elected PC members met most recently in November and January. Mr. Igel, CEO, addressed the new incoming PC members and many important Head Start topics were discussed. PC members receive ongoing training on Program Governance as well as Head Start policy. The combined force of the Board of Directors and the Policy Council, along with management staff, are a powerful force that provides leadership and strategic direction for the organization.

Health Services


The Yeled Health Services team organized a virtual Health Advisory Committee meeting in December to talk about Flu. Covid-19 and the effects on our community. Also discussed was recent health policy updates such as the certification of all teaching staff in First Aid and CPR, and the training of all Head start staff in SIDS and Shaken Baby syndrome with an Aspire certified instructor. Attendees at the meeting, besides for YvY Health Coordinators and staff, included Dr. Jeffrey Teitelbaum, Medical Director of Ezra Medical Center, Dr Kenneth Bromberg, Dr. Alyssa Masor, Community Liaison of NYC DOH's Division of Disease Control, representatives from other local Head Start sites and more.

Yeled v'Yalda's Special Education Department is servicing over 4,500 students across hundreds of schools with many of these students receiving multiple services such as Speech, OT, PT, SEIT etc. Our providers are renowned for their professional instruction and ardent devotion to their students. We have been working in tandem with the schools we service to coach their educators in some of the latest therapeutic methods which can be applied in the classroom. Our Clinical Supervision Leaders have also organized a rigorous training schedule to accommodate the many schools we service. This partnership optimizes each student's support in school, as lessons learned in their therapy sessions are carried over to the classroom. YVY's robust Professional Development Program has also arranged for full day symposiums for OT's/ PT's/ and SLP's. Monthly SEIT Teleconferences are provided targeting preschool student curriculum and multiple courses geared to our Pendency providers are offered to help our elementary students reach their Reading and Comprehension goals. YVY continues to invest in teacher trainings and providers' continued education to best service each and every student in our program so each child's learning needs can best be met.



ABA Insurance services are running full steam ahead. Services are taking place in a variety of settings including ABA centers, schools, special ed programs and homes. The insurance program provides a comprehensive approach, whereby the BCBA oversees the child's case in its entirety and collaborates with all the members of the team to ensure the child's overall progress. This, in addition to training the paraprofessional on carrying out ABA therapy, which specifically addresses the behavior and social goals outlined in the child's individual treatment plan. Significant strides have been noted for the many children in our program, giving us a tremendous sense of pride in our providers and the work they do. Here at Yeled our aim is to consistently educate our Behavior Analysts (BCBAs) on all cutting-edge techniques, by providing many opportunities for professional development. The ABA Insurance program recently hosted a two-part series workshop on the "Talkies" and "Visualizing and Verbalizing" programs. The trainings were well attended and received rave reviews, providing methods to understand and improve reading and listening comprehension, memory, oral vocabulary, critical thinking and writing. The next training event is planned to take place on February 24. 2022, featuring the world-renowned behaviorist, Greg Hanley. 
